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### For the Teacher

This lesson introduces learners to names of fruits and vegetables

The weather will relate the story - "The Potato and the Apple" which will be followed by comprehension questions in the 'Lot's talk' activity. The teacher will encourage learners to work in pairs and talk to each other about the quartel between Potato and Apple The teacher will constantly monitor the conversation between the learners and may help them whenever required.

The teacher will recite the poem - "Apple grapes and learners will recite collectively at first and then the tracher will help them to recite individually. The teacher may extend this activity by telling frames that these builts tack cover.

The seacher will sitter the words - postate, papaya, pumpkin and help learners to produce and say the Listening and saying beginning sounds beginning sound 'p' The teacher may extend this activity by adding more words beginning with 'p'

The tracher will suitage a Rose play by allowing learners to work in pairs. This activity will help learners to learn to speak profetely as situations unside the classroom and outside in other real life situations.

Games with words

In Accoving 23, the teacher will belo the learners to make words with the letters in the grid. One letter may be used many times to make as many words as they can. The teacher may use various language gumes that are age appropriate and that help in achieving the learning outcomes.

Reading In Activity 27, the teacher may help learners to spell and read the three letter words like - hen, hat, mug and must. The teacher will note how learners pronounce the vowel sounds in these and other words This practice should be a continuous one with different words.

By the end of this lesson, learners will be able to draw some fruits and vegetables and write their names. By the end of Lesson 5, learners will be enriched with the ability to comprehend instructions from their teachers in order to write, draw and polour pictures.
