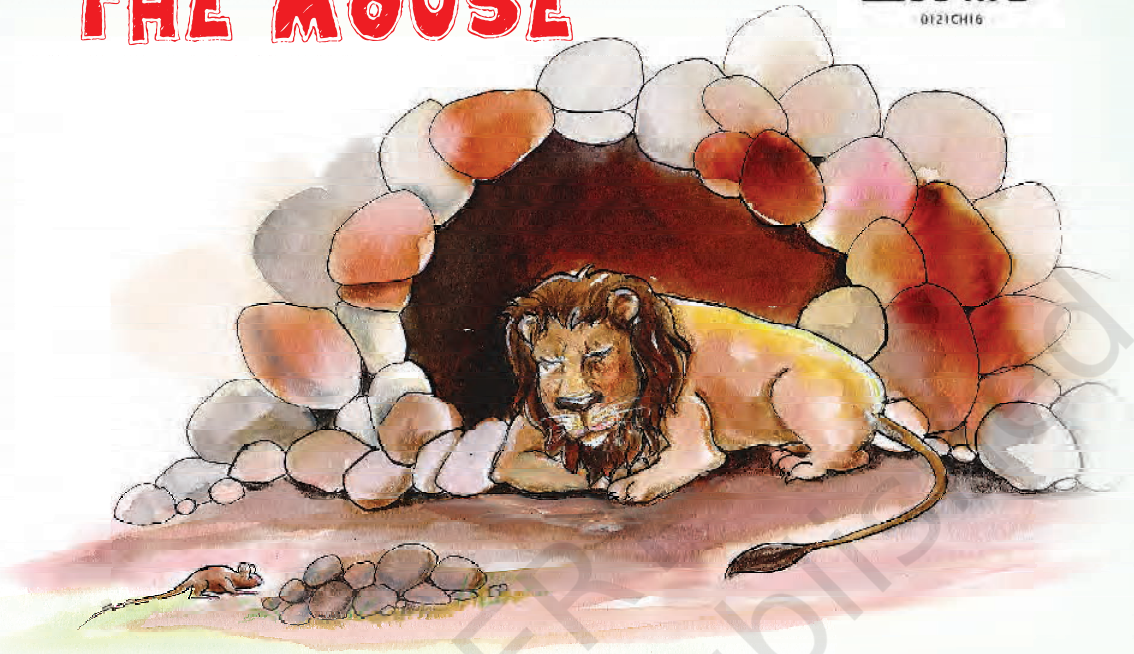
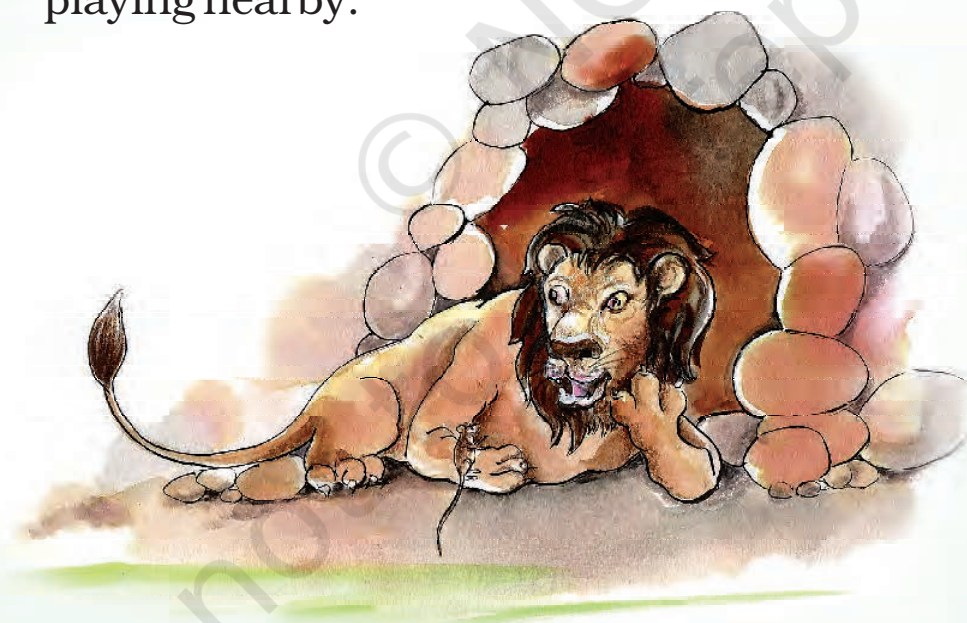


16 THE LION AND THE MOUSE



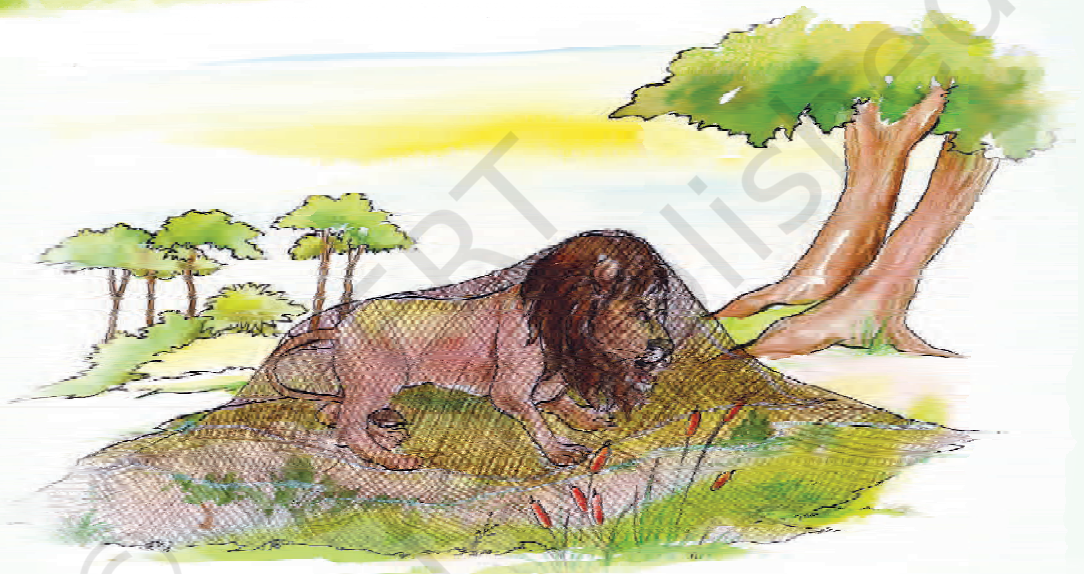
A lion was sleeping. A little mouse was playing nearby.



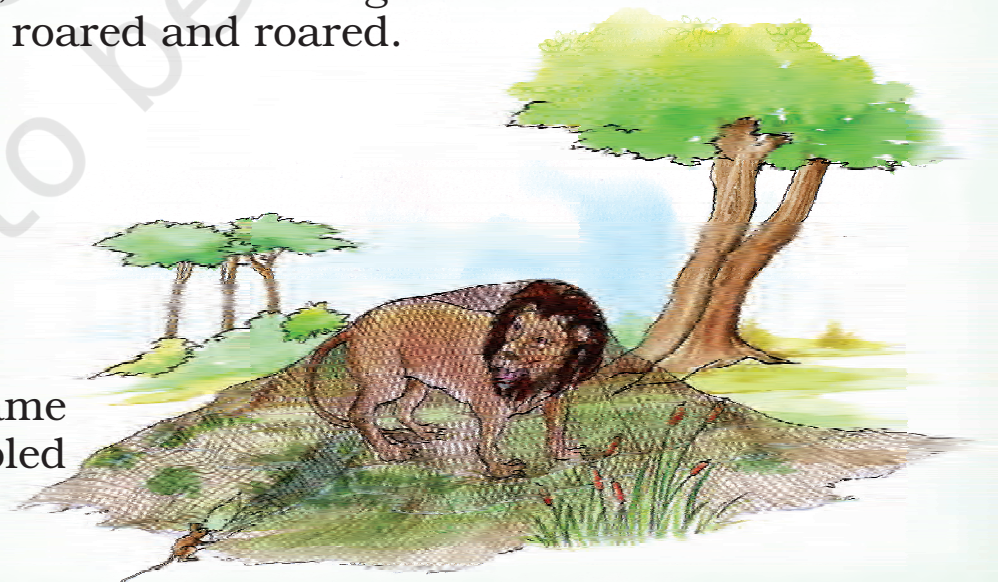
The lion woke up. The lion caught the mouse. The mouse said, "Let me go, please. I shall help you some day."

You cannot help me. Go away."

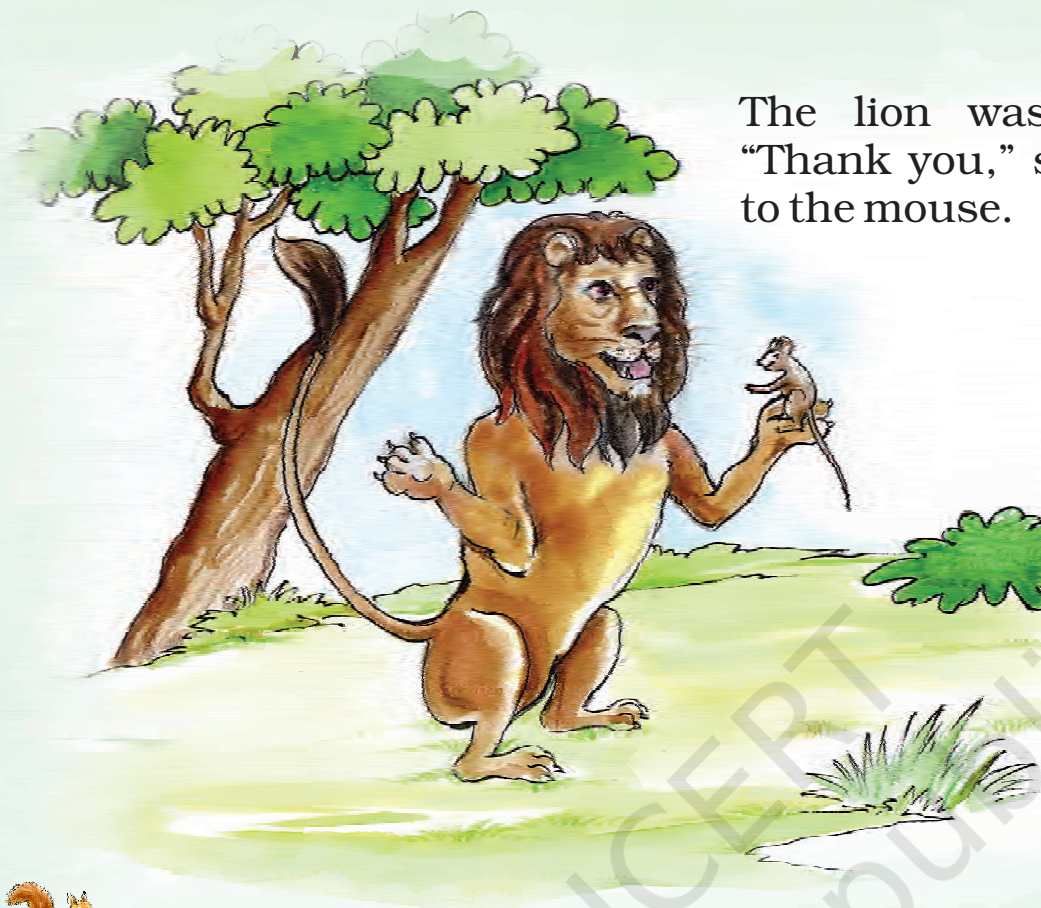


Some days later, the lion was caught

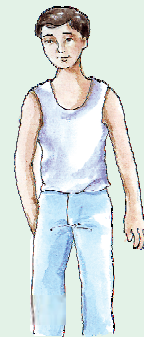
