In this positive sense, mental health is the foundation for individual well-being and the effective functioning of a community. More than 450 million people suffer from mental disorders. Global burden of mental health will be well beyond the treatment capacities of developed and developing countries. The social and economic costs associated with growing burden of mental ill health focused the possibilities for promoting mental health as well as preventing and treating mental illness. Thus, Mental Health is linked to behaviour and seen as fundamental to physical health and quality of life.
