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बाल गंगाधर तिलक का जन्म 23 जुलाई, 1856 को महाराष्ट्र के रत्नागिरि में हुआ था। उनके दादा केशवराव पेशवा राज्य में उच्च पद पर आसीन थे। तिलक के पिता गंगाधर पंत अध्यापक थे। उन्होंने बाल को संस्कृत, गणित एवं मराठी का अच्छा ज्ञान घर पर ही करा दिया था। वे 1866 में पूना में नगर स्कूल में भर्ती हुए। उनकी स्मरण शक्ति अदभुत थी। संस्कृत के सहस्रों श्लोक उन्होंने कंठस्थ कर लिए थे। स्कूल में तिलक ने निर्भयता तथा सत्य का अनेक अवसरों पर परिचय दिया। 1871 में पन्द्रह वर्ष की आयु में उनका विवाह तपीबाई से हो गया। पिता की असामयिक मृत्यु के बाद उनके चाचा गोविन्द राम उनके अभिभावक बने। विष्णु शास्त्री एवं तिलक ने मिलकर पूना में न्यू इंगलिश स्कूल की 1880 में स्थापना की।
