(1) India has stood for freedom: Even before Independence we viewed our own struggle and difficulties on the larger canvas of global problems. If democracy is basically tolerance for others' opinions, the concept of coexistence is democracy on the international plane, for it embodies tolerance of other nations and systems.

Similarly non-alignment gives depth to our independence and self-reliance for it enables us to retain our freedom of judgement and action on international issues in the light of our national interests. We avoid involvement in the conflicts and disputes of others and this helps to blunt conflict between power blocs. I should like to think that it has also helped world stability.

- (2) A country is an extended family. should not cause too much dislocation or suffering for the people nor should it jettison the basic spiritual and cultural values of our civilization.

- (4) India's planning experience sums up the successes and problems of our democratic development. The magnitude and significance of democracy's operation in India are not well understood, for it is often treated as an adventitious or borrowed growth. Why has democracy worked in India? Our national leadership was dedicated to it and we wanted it to work, but, also, because in our society there were elements and traditions which supported the growth of democracy.
- (5) In our democratic system, there may be differences in many spheres but we rise above them. To achieve the objective of keeping the country united, we have to transcend political and party-based differences, which create dissensions. If we cannot remain united and the country does not remain strong, with whom shall we have differences? Against whom shall we fight? With whom shall we be friends? Brothers and sisters, if the country falls, nobody survives. When we were fighting for the freedom of our country, it did not mean only political freedom. It also meant social justice, equality and economic justice. Only one phase is over and another one is under way. We have to cover a long and difficult path. Whereas the enemies were visible during those days; now they are in disguise. Some of them are openly our enemies, but many become unintentional pawns of others.

- (1) The number of children and teens that are overweight or obese has more than tripled between the years of 1980 and 2004. While obesity is not restricted by gender, ethnicity or socio-economic status, there is a slightly increased risk for those who are from poorer families. Girls are more likely to be overweight than boys, and Hispanic and African American teens are slightly more likely to be obese than other races.
- (2) Younger people, especially teens who are obese, face multiple problems caused by their weight. First, they face the same health problems that an overweight adult would, including cardiovascular disease, diabetes, kidney disease, hypertension and cancer. Second, they face developmental troubles because of their weight and their health, especially if they are unable to go to school on a regular basis. And finally, they also face social development problems as they struggle to develop their personality while facing peer pressures beyond what the average child is facing.
- (3) Children and teens become obese for a variety of reasons: they tend to eat a poorly balanced diet filled with fast foods and very limited fruits and vegetables. One study showed that girls and boys ages 10 to 15 admitted that French fries were the only vegetable that they consumed on a regular basis. Another study showed that girls would eat other vegetables but only if they were covered in a cheese sauce.
- (4) In addition to poor food choices, they tend to be very sedentary, most of them spending most of their time in front of a television or computer screen or texting and talking on their cell phones. Finally, the children in the study that were found to be the most overweight also had overweight parents, suggesting not only a genetic link to explain their weight but an atmospheric one as well. After all, children of smokers tend to be smokers themselves, so it would stand to reason that obese parents typically will produce obese children.
- (5) The problem with weight and young teens, especially girls, is the fact that dieting and weight loss programs tend to backfire. In a three-year study that monitored boys and girls, ages 9 to 14, the dieters ultimately gained more weight than those who did not diet at all. It is necessary to use a different approach when dealing with young children and teens who are overweight. First, the family must be in total agreement that there is a problem. Several school districts came under fire in recent years when they sent home letters regarding a child's weight and the health risks. The parents were either unaware that their child could develop such "adult" health problems as Type II diabetes or heart disease, or they did not accept that the child was anything but "stocky" or "husky". Rather than face the legal ramifications, the school districts stopped informing the parents, hoping that the child's doctor would take on the battle instead.
- (6) It is normal for a girl to increase her body fat during puberty; it is simply the way that the female body works. At this time, it is common for the girls to start paying more attention to

their physical appearance, with many of them developing eating disorders because they are unhappy with what they see. It should also be noted that these girls are more likely to develop depression, which may also increase their chance of gaining even more weight.

(7) Boys start adding more muscle and also increase in height, leading them to feel more satisfied with their bodies, while young girls are getting increasingly more upset by what they see in the mirror. By the age of 15, over half of the girls in 16 countries are dieting. The United States is the country that has the most weight-obsessed girls, with 47% of girls aged 11, dieting and 62% of 15-year-olds doing so. Ethnicity plays a role in how the girls feel about their bodies, with African American girls feeling more body satisfaction than Caucasian girls of the same age group.



5. A. The graph shows the number of boys and girls who pursued different hobbies in USA. As shown in the chart, gardening is the most favorite pastime among girls and the least favourite among boys with levels of over 65 and less than 30 respectively. For all other amusements, singing, painting and cycling are very popular among both the genders. As per the given chart the number of boys preferring cycling and girls doing gardening is almost equal. Most boys like to do cycling with around 65 compared to 55 girls.

Girls also like to do painting with levels of around 60, on the contrary only 40 boys like to do painting in their leisure time. There is a difference of about 20 between boys and girls showing interest in reading books. Around 50 girls like to read books in their free time whereas, only 30 boys in comparison to girls showed their interest in it. On the other hand, other than cycling, boys are more interested in singing, where almost 55 boys are there numbering 10 more than girls.

Overall, the figures demonstrate that girls significantly love to spend most of their leisure time on gardening and painting, and after that time on cycling and reading books, and the least they want to spend on singing. However, boys preferred cycling the most, then singing and painting but significantly the least they preferred to do is gardening.
