


THE BOY WHO CRIED WOLF



In sentence (1) we see that the phrase 'well enough' modifies the verb 'liked'. Similarly, in sentence (2) the word 'very' modifies the adjective 'bad'. Hence, the word/phrase, 'well enough' and 'very' are adverb/ adverb phrase respectively.

An adverb/ adverb phrase modifies a verb, an adjective or another adverb.
