The Directive Principles of the Constitution enumerated in the textbook.

Solution:

- The directive instructions specified by the Constitution to the State on how to achieve the goals, expressed in the Preamble, are called as Directive Principles of State Policy.
- 2. The Directive Principles of the Constitution enumerated in the textbook are as follows: a. The State must ensure sufficient means of livelihood for all citizens without any gender discrimination.
 - b. The State must ensure equal pay for equal work for both men and women.
 - c. The State must ensure that the public health improves.
 - d. The State must ensure the protection and improvement of the environment by safeguarding the forests and wild-life of the country.
 - e. The State should protect all monuments of historic interest and national importance. f. The State should promote, with special care, the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the society, especially the Scheduled Castes and Tribes. g. The State should offer public assistance to citizens in cases of unemployment, old age, sickness, etc.
 - h. The State should secure a uniform civil code applicable to the entire country.

Exercise | Q 5.2 | Page 87

The provision of a uniform civil code for citizens in the Directive Principles of the Indian Constitution.

Solution:

- Secularism is one of our goals as per our Preamble. Accordingly, all religions are considered as equal. No one religion is considered to be the State religion and the citizens are free to follow their own religion.
- 2. Also, to make India a 'Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic Republic', the principles of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity have been included in our Preamble.
- 3. Implementing a uniform civil code for citizens will help realise the above goals, support the above principles and prevent any discrimination among individuals on the basis of caste, creed, race, language, region, place of birth, or sex.
- 4. This will help realise the larger goal of public welfare which in turn will help the nation to progress. Hence, the provision of a uniform civil code for citizens is included in the Directive Principles of the Indian Constitution.

Exercise | Q 5.3 | Page 87

Why is it said that the Directive Principles and Fundamental Rights are two sides of the same coin?

Solution:

- Fundamental Rights give citizens the most needed liberty. On the other hand,
 Directive Principles of State Policy create an atmosphere conducive to the
 growth of democracy.
- 2. Although we cannot go to the courts if the government does not implement a Directive, we can put pressure on the Government to make a policy in accordance with the Directive Principles.
- 3. This implies that the Directive Principles and Fundamental Rights are both specified in the Constitution with a common goal of public welfare.

Hence, we can say that the Directive Principles and Fundamental Rights are two sides of the same coin.

What are the ways in which citizens can conserve the environment? Write with examples.

Solution:

- 1. The living and non-living components of the environment like animals and trees, air, water, etc are natural resources. It is our duty to protect the resources of our country.
- 2. It is important to maintain a balance between these natural components to maintain a stable environment. Even if we take into account one component, that is air, citizen can do many things to protect it. As trees maintain the balance between the different components of air like oxygen and carbon dioxide, citizens can run campaigns for conserving trees around them and also for planting new trees in their surroundings.
- 3. A moderate and a considerate use of natural resources will also help to conserve the environment.
- 4. Example:
 - a. Instead of using a four-wheeler to go to nearby places, one may opt for a bicycle and prevent air pollution.
 - b. Car-pooling (sharing the ride with friends and co-workers) is another option to reduce the consumption of fuel and reduce air-pollution.
