

They got themselves executed. Thus the guru saved his disciple.

- dream to paint masterpiece
- Sue asked to paint ivy last leaf
- worked in cold winter rain and caught pneumonia
- he died but succeeded in saving Johnsy' s life
- any other relevant point/ points

Model Answer

Behrman was a painter. His dream was to paint masterpiece. But he was not successful yet . When Johnsy fell ill, her friend Sue, asked him to paint an ivy leaf on the outer wall of the house. His dream did come true. He worked in the cold winter rain. He caught pneumonia and died. His painting proved a masterpiece. Even Johnsy, who was herself an artist, couldn't know that it was not a real leaf. She took it to be a real leaf and regained the desire to live. Thus Behrman's painting proved a masterpiece because it saved the life of a girl who had lost all hopes of recovery.
