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Explanations

- c The subject of the sentence is 'nothing' singular and not 'fraud and double-dealing'. Hence, 'is', not 'are'.
- 2. c The adverb 'much' cannot be used here. It should be 'you look very handsome now'.
- c Amount refers to bulk or mass, number to individuals or units. (e.g. a large number of cars) and large amount of sugar. Hence, 'numbers' should be replaced by 'amount'.
- 4. d 'Of the disabled' is the right usage as we refer to a class, hence the article 'the' is required.
- 5. c 'alright' is the correct spelling.
- 6. b Since we are talking about the 'future course of events', the right word is 'predict'.
- c If you read the following lines that follow, you will know that the right word is 'complacent' to fit into the context.
- 8. d 'ahead' is grammatically correct.
- 9. b 'relax' is the right verb here. The rest don't fit sensibly into the sentence.
- 10. b Choices (c) and (d) are incorrect because (c) is grammatically incorrect while (d) implies that the future course of events is predetermined. Choice (a) implies a command which does not fit here. Choice (b) is the correct option as it includes an element of uncertainty.
- 11. a The mandatory pair 'AB' opens the sentence by introducing the subject of the sentence 'world's best-selling doll'. 'DE' is a mandatory pair as it gives us the complete word 'mid-life crisis'. Hence, option (a) is the correct answer.
- 12. b A follows B as it describes the 'demand' i.e. it is plummeting fast. Hence, 'BA' is a mandatory pair. However, this can be found only in option (b). Hence, it is the correct option.

- 13. c 'AB' is a mandatory pair as B describes the subject i.e. 'their products'. D follows B as the preposition of is required here. Hence, 'ABDCE' is the correct sequence.
- 14. d 'EA' is the obvious opener as it gives us the subject of the sentence i.e. 'the appeal of toys'. Hence, option (d) is the correct answer.
- 15. d 'AB' is the opening mandatory pair as it introduces the subject i.e. 'the human crisis'. 'ED' is also a mandatory pair, as the adjective *existential* will precede the noun *questions*. Hence, 'ABCED' is the correct sequence.
- 16. b 'by' is the correct preposition to be used.
- 17. d You ram something 'into' something else.
- 18. d 'creative' is the right adjective form to be used to modify 'furies'.
- 19. d 'shortage' indicates scarcity.
- 20. b 'devoid' indicates 'lack of something'.
- 21. b Since 'hardly' conveys a negative meaning, 'can' should be used.
- 22. a Use 'fewer' to indicate individuals, 'less' is used to refer to bulk or mass.
- 23. d Use 'burst', there is no such word as 'bursted'.
- 24. a Use 'neither' as we are referring to two persons only.
- 25. b Use the singular verb 'plans' to refer to the government (singular noun).
- 26. a 'to offer something' is the right usage.
- 27. b 'purposely' is the right usage in the context.
- 28. c 'didn't' goes as a negative with the positive 'did'.
- 29. d 'press' refers to the journalists here.
- 30. d 'as well' adds on to the positive qualities that must have come prior to this sentence.
