Foreword

'Prudence' is designed for the students at Senior Secondary level in Rajasthan as a text-book for English Literature. The text-book consists of five sections, namely Short stories, Poetry, Non-fiction, Drama, and lastly, Reading-Writing and Grammar. The aim of this selection is to make reading a pleasurable activity and the texts have a global flavour including illustrious authors, poets and playwrights from Britain, Ireland, America, Poland, New Zealand, China and India. Many of them are Nobel Laureates as well as the litterateurs who innovated in different genres, techniques and forms. Technical innovators like Joseph Conrad, Virginia Woolf, James Joyce etc. will prove interesting and challenging studies. The world literature is aimed at developing a deep and sensitive understanding of life at the universal level.

The poetry section includes selected poems of different ages and climes. Authors like Donne, Milton, Sri Aurobindo , Ramanujan, Blake, Rudyard Kipling and Emily Dickenson will prove a lyrical treat to the students. At the same time, Non-fiction section will expose the students to some thought-provoking issues in literature. The play by Girish Karnad is an interesting study of psychological conflict and dilemma. The comedy of G.B. Shaw will tickle the students.

The exercises at the end of every chapter aim at developing critical reading ability and instilling in them the confidence to express their responses. A glossary of literary terms has been provided at the end of the Poetry section. Reading and writing section is to develop critical thinking and literary appreciation. The grammar section is aimed at developing a sensitivity to particular nuances of language.

Suggestions from the teachers and students to improve this book are welcome.
