1. It has been assessed that radicalisation is a security threat to India. Explain the basis of such an assessment with examples. What are the key pillars of the counter radicalisation strategy of the government?

Growing tide of ISIS led radicalization has made headlines in India too. Radicalization is the phenomenon of moulding a person's ideological and belief system on orthodox and extreme communal grounds.

It is being said that growing radicalization poses threat to security in India because —

- 1) India is a multi-religious country. There is no scope of communalism to thrive in India.
- 2) Kerala — Under the growing funding of Wahabism ideologues and radical elements 13 youths (well educated and well to do families) joined ISIS in Syria.

3) Kashmir - Due to Saudi led propagation of Wahabi ideology, as many as 700 mosques have been reformed into old orthodox state. Its influence can be seen as more youths agitating against Burhan Wani's death and burning down of schools.

4) Beef and communalism - dadri lynching and una riots by radical Hindu groups leading to destruction of harmony.

Counter-radicalization

- 1) Skill development and employment of youth
- 2) Education - moral and liberal values
- 3) Schemes of national integration - 'Nar Manjil' and Ustaad
- 4) Good governance

2. Arguments on Siachen issue often move around the idea of demilitarisation. Examining the key attributes of the Siachen issue explain the basis of arguments regarding its demilitarisation? Also highlight the arguments against such an idea.

Siachen issue

It is a junction of China, Pakistan and India. The peace agreement did not delineate beyond pillar N8842 leaving scope for conflict.

Pakistan says it extends from N8842 to saltora ridge while India says same line will extend further to Karakoram Pass. As of today, India occupies it.

Demilitarization

- For:
- ① Sub-50°C is inhabitable
 - ② No much strategic importance because India can not use it to stop any combat
 - ③ Heavy casualty due to climate
846 died since ~~2003~~¹⁹⁸ - 2013.

- Against:
- ① If India demilitarize and Pak-China joint occupation can hamper Ladakh fronts
 - ② Once lost it will be impossible to regain it.
 - ③ Better equipments can reduce casualty.
 - ④ Symbolic importance of occupation

But, recent death of 11 soldiers in an avalanche has again rekindled the debate on demilitarization. Mutual demilitarization by Pak-India is difficult to achieve and lack of Trust is the main reason behind militarization.

3. Money laundering and terrorism have strong inter linkages. Illustrate. In this context, how far do the steps taken by the government confirm with the international commitments?

मनी लॉन्ड्रिंग और आतंकवाद मजबूती से एक-दुसरे से सम्बद्ध हैं। स्पष्ट कीजिए। इस संदर्भ में, सरकार द्वारा उठाए गए कदम किस हद तक अंतरराष्ट्रीय प्रतिबद्धताओं की पूर्ति करते हैं?

Money laundering and Terrorism are illustrated from following examples—

1) Mumbai blasts : Dawood used his black money to fund 1993 Mumbai blasts that led to more than 100 casualties.

2) ISIS funding : Daesh is able to sustain such a long attack on so many fronts due to ill gotten money from oil and arms sales.

Black money is used to fund various terrorist activities because this money is unaccounted, unreported and hence untraceable and it helps them to evade any intelligence.

3) Saudi fund for spreading extreme

Ideology of Wahabism in Kerala and Kashmir. Zakir Naik influenced many youth into radicalization eventually leading them to join IS.

Steps taken by government:

- 1) India joined FATF in 2000 to fight against money laundering.
- 2) Black money bill passed in both the houses.
- 3) Prevention of Money Laundering Act 2002.
- 4) Revised definition of Terrorism to include economic aspects of Unlawful Activities Prevention Act 1967.
- 5) De-radicalization by schemes such as Mai Manzil.
- 6) Increased surveillance and NIA monitoring of Saudi funding of religious institutions in India.

4. Longstanding issue of insurgency in the Northeast highlights the linkage between violence, remoteness, underdevelopment and alienation. Elaborate. Also, suggest some corrective measures for a lasting resolution of the conflicts in this region.

पूर्वोत्तर में लम्बे समय से विद्यमान उग्रवाद का मुद्दा वस्तुतः हिंसा, दूरी, अल्पविकास, और अलगाव की भावना के मध्य के संबंधों पर प्रकाश डालता है। सविस्तार व्याख्या कीजिये। इसके साथ ही इस क्षेत्र में संघर्ष के एक स्थायी समाधान के लिए कुछ सुधारात्मक उपायों का सुझाव भी दीजिए।

Insurgency issues in North-East are multi-faceted and multi-reasoned.
For example:

Assam — Due to migration and ethnic.

Nagaland — Policy of isolation, ethnic.

Manipur — Inter-Tribal, religious, Plain vs hilly areas, Tribal vs Non tribal.

But there are certain underlying commonalities in them such as —

- ① All are violent efforts — Easily available funding and arms from an open border of Myanmar and Bangladesh.
- ② Remoteness, alienation and unequal development — Due to difficult terrain, small chicken neck available for communication with mainland, these areas

have failed to develop at a good pace. Intra-regional isolation, alienation and economic disparity is huge. Hilly areas inhabited by tribals have not received their share of pie. This has resulted in segmentation and mutual friction. National integration has not been successful in making any inroads into these areas.

Corrective measures —

- 1) Negotiation and dialogue to counter extreme ideology.
- 2) Good governance to restore faith and erode support base of insurgents.
- 3) Equitable and holistic development of all areas.
- 4) Make AFSPA less extreme and more accountable.
- 5) Cut the funding and arms base of insurgents.

5. While on the one hand China's One Road One Belt initiative poses security concerns and challenges for India, on the other, it can help improve India's connectivity to major markets and resource supplies. Discuss.

China's initiative of linking old silk routes by new road, rail and maritime routes is called One Road - One Belt. Ambitious OROB initiative has three main sub initiatives —

- ① Linking China to Europe via Russia and Central Asia by road and sea routes.
- ② CPEC — China Pakistan Economic Corridor. Linking Xinjiang province to Gwadar Port of China.
- ③ Linking China to South Asia via Nanjing - Singapore roads.

Security concerns for India

CPEC linking Xinjiang province to Gwadar Port passes through POK area of Pakistan claimed by India

Closeness to the Indian border and disputed territory raises India's security concerns.

Possible Benefits :

- ① Closeness of India to CPEC and Nanjing - Singapore corridor can be used by India to exploit benefit for North East regions rich in oil and gas and develop viable market for Kashmir area.
- ② China - Europe road and rail link can be accessed by India via trade relations with Central Asian countries

Thus, they can be used by India to access European Market and South Asian market and also serve the needs of resources to North Eastern states.

6. NATGRID was an ambitious step involving intelligence reforms, however, it remained a non-starter. Explain. In the context of recent initiatives to revive the NATGRID and the challenges it faced previously what steps are required to make it effective?

नेटग्रिड (NATGRID) इंटेलिजेंस सुधारों से सम्बंधित एक महत्वाकांक्षी कदम था, हालांकि यह शुरू नहीं हो पाया। व्याख्या कीजिए। नेटग्रिड को पुनर्जीवित करने की हाल की पहल और पूर्व में इसके द्वारा सामना की गयी चुनौतियों के संदर्भ में, इसे प्रभावी बनाने के लिए कौन-से कदम उठाए जाने की आवश्यकता है?

NATGRID — National Intelligence Grid was envisaged by P. Chidambaram in 2009 post Mumbai attacks in 2008.

Main features:

- 1) Common platform for 11 different investigating agencies for sharing data.
- 2) Data related to credit usage, bank threats, intelligence could have proved to be effective in avoiding terror attacks.
- 3) Co-ordinated and common efforts would have fostered anti-terror operations.

But, it failed to take off because of following reasons —

- 1) RAW and IB objected on intelligence data sharing with others.
- 2) No investigating agency wanted to come under others' subordination
- 3) After initial outburst and enthusiasm governments will subsequently subside.

Recently post Pathankot attack and criticism of un-co-ordinated manner of handling terror attack, government decided to revive NATGRID and work on National Security Doctrine.

Challenges:

All previous impediments of superiority, mistrust are still prevalent among intelligence agencies.

Steps to be taken:

- 1) Negotiation with all agencies.
- 2) Unified command centre
- 3) SOP should be developed.

7. India's national security architecture faces a difficult task in detecting digital intrusion in cyberspace. What are the challenges India faces w.r.t. Digital Intrusion? How can these challenges be overcome?

भारत की राष्ट्रीय सुरक्षा अवसंरचना, साइबर स्पेस में डिजिटल घुसपैठ का पता लगाने में मुश्किलों का सामना कर रही है। डिजिटल घुसपैठ के सन्दर्भ में भारत किन चुनौतियों का सामना कर रहा है? इन चुनौतियों को कैसे दूर किया जा सकता है?

India enacted Nation Cyber Policy in 2013. But, it failed to address many challenges mentioned below—

- 1) Cyber intrusion is a multi-location, multi-layered. Thus, it is difficult to trace the origins.
- 2) Prime source is always located out of the country. India has not acceded to Budapest Convention of UN on cyber crime. Thus, even if traced, India can do nothing.
- 3) Cyber crime is fast and has virtual identity and digital finger prints are removed very far.
- 4) Isolation of Indian network is not possible. Hence, it is always susceptible for intrusion.

- 5) Cyber Security professionals can not match to the new technological variations.

These challenges can be overcome by—

- 1) Unified command centre for all cyber related breaches either in NICITIP or CERT-in.
- 2) Regular revision of Policy and Acts.
- 3) Technology developments to make pace with criminals.
- 4) Open source to be used as they are not hackable.
- 5) International co-operation
- 6) Local Servers and Local network such as NKN.

8. Relations with Iran hold a lot of potential for India's ambitions for West Asia and beyond, however, realising this potential also involves certain global and regional challenges. Examine.

ईरान के साथ संबंध वस्तुतः पश्चिम एशिया और उससे परे भारत की महत्वाकांक्षा के लिए संभवनाओं से परिपूर्ण हैं, तथापि इस संभावना को साकार करने के मार्ग में कुछ वैश्विक तथा क्षेत्रीय चुनौतियां भी हैं। परीक्षण कीजिए।

Strategic importance of Iran

- 1) India imports most of its oil and gas from Iran. Thus dependent for energy security.
- 2) India developed port of Chabahar in Iran and has signed a pact for SEZ in the port city. This will give India ability to easily access Central Asia and Europe.
- 3) Iran can also help India in civil nuclear technology.

Global regional challenges

- 1) Afghanistan: Stability of Afghanistan is must for peace in the region and India can play a healthy role in Afghanistan only via Iran.

2) Saudi - Iran conflict : Saudi is Sunni dominated and Iran is Shia dominated. Both want to exert dominion over arab world. India has good relations with both; maintaining it would be a challenge.

3) Iran - Israel : India has good relations with both but they have antagonistic relations.

4) ISIS in Syria, Iraq : Global terrorism is a threat to all countries.

5) Turkey - Although India does not have established trade relations with Turkey but peace of Turkey is also important for the peace of the region.

9. The internal crisis in Nepal over the past few years has given concrete shape to the fears of China gaining upper hand vis-a-vis a traditionally influential India. Elaborate. What can India do to further strengthen its ties with the Himalayan nation?

Recent adoption of new constitution by Nepal government raised many issues where plain area habited by Madhesi alleged dis-mal-delineitation by hilly people (minority) to retain dominance.

Madhesi areas are contiguous to the Indian borders. Protests and Indian response to Constitution was taken in a negative tone by the newly elected Oli government and they alleged -

- ① Blockade by India for basic supplies.
- ② Unnecessarily interference in internal matters of governance by India.

This led to Nepal government to talk to China to built alternative routes for trade and supplies.

Nepal also became aware of its over-dependency on India and available China-card to arm-twist India.

China has shown interest in developing and extending the road and rail network in Nepal and Tibet. But it is quite unusual for China to open up Tibet to foreign countries.

Possible alternatives for India

- 1) Enhance dialogue and negotiation
- 2) Increase aid for rebuilding work post earth quake to garner goodwill.
- 3) Assure no such backhanded blockade by the governments.
- 4) Resolve to maintain and respect sovereignty of Nepal.

10. The Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement (TPP), touted as the world's biggest trade deal to date, has danger of bending the WTO rules. In this context, discuss the impact TPP can have on India's foreign trade. What are the options that India has to deal with the issues arising out of the TPP?

विश्व के सबसे बड़े व्यापार समझौते के रूप में प्रचारित ट्रांस-पैसिफिक पार्टनरशिप (टी.पी.पी.) समझौते द्वारा डब्ल्यू.टी.ओ. के नियमों को प्रभावित करने की आशंका है। इस परिप्रेक्ष्य में भारत के विदेश व्यापार पर टी.पी.पी. के संभावित प्रभावों की चर्चा कीजिए। टी.पी.पी. से उत्पन्न मुद्दों से निपटने के लिए भारत के पास क्या विकल्प हैं?

WTO formed in 1994 is a common forum for trade and economic activities.

TPP is an envisaged Free Trade Agreement allowed under WTO rules between Pacific boundary countries and America which will trade almost half of world trade.

Over the years, WTO has significantly lost its ground over various issues such as IPR, SSM, stock holding, export subsidies etc. Doha round has failed to address and precipitate into a common drop acceptable to all.

Growing segmentation (G7, G8, G20 etc) have led to inconclusive Doha round of WTO.

Interestingly during the same period US has developed new strategy to force its will on developing countries via FTA. All partner countries have to maintain strict IPR standards.

Thus, India will be forced to loose its IPR stand on compulsory licensing and evergreening or it will loose its market for generic medicines in LMVT countries which are a part of TTP.

Options available to India

- 1) Adhere to better IPR standards
- 2) SPS standards need to be adhered.
- 3) Enhance capability and quality of products to make them competitive.
- 4) RCEP with ASEAN + Six countries can be a game changer for India.

11. Legal proceedings initiated by the Marshall Islands against India, Pakistan and Britain over nuclear weapons in the International Court of Justice highlights the issues of jurisdiction of the court. What is India's position vis-a-vis the jurisdiction of the ICJ? Also differentiate between binding and advisory pronouncements of the court with suitable examples.

अंतर्राष्ट्रीय न्यायालय (आई.सी.जे.) में मार्शल द्वीपसमूह द्वारा भारत, पाकिस्तान तथा ब्रिटेन के खिलाफ परमाणु हथियारों को ले कर आरम्भ की गयी कानूनी कार्यवाहियाँ वस्तुतः इस न्यायालय के क्षेत्राधिकार के मुद्दे को उजागर करती हैं। अंतर्राष्ट्रीय न्यायालय के क्षेत्राधिकार के संदर्भ में भारत का क्या रुख है? साथ ही उचित उदाहरण प्रस्तुत करते हुए न्यायालय के बाध्यकारी तथा सलाहकारी निर्णयों के बीच अंतर स्पष्ट कीजिए।

Recently, ICJ ruled out against Marshall Islands proceeding to implicate India, Pakistan and UK over possession of nuclear weapons. But it raises serious concerns over the jurisdiction of ICJ over internal defense matters of countries.

India's position:

India strongly refuted on the point that ICJ cannot allow proceedings on the internal matters of a country just on the basis of possible threats.

International Court of Justice is a UN body and has following two

rules to play —

① Issue binding pronouncement

Eg Italy Marine case. ICTJ allowed Marine to be allowed to go to Italy till the judgement is decided.

② Issue advisory pronouncement

12. Even though the refugee crisis in Europe does not affect India directly, it presents an opportunity for India to showcase its commitment and capability to take greater responsibility in dealing with global issues. Comment in light of India's strengths, experience and international commitments regarding refugees.

Post Arab Spring, many countries such as Libya, Syria etc are war torn and has seen mass exodus by people trying to make an inway into Europe via sea routes. It has led to a refugee crisis where many countries have refused to accept refugees.

In dealing with such situation India has better strengths such as —

- ① India is a multi-ethnic, multi-culture country with thriving democracy.
- ② India has in the past successfully been a peaceful refuge —
 1. For Parsis during Medieval period
 2. For Tibetans.
 3. For Tamilians from Sri Lanka.

Although India has not acceded to the UN Convention on Refugees, 1951 but still India accepts refugees as per the ethos of human governance.

India is trying to talk and negotiate a deal with Bangladesh to take back its 1971 war refugees.

13. India is endowed with an amazing variety and wealth of soft power resources. Providing examples, illustrate the utilisation of soft power in diplomatic initiatives of the recent past. What are the limitations of the soft power approach in diplomacy in case of a developing country such as India?

India has a rich history of civilization that continues till today. Over this period India has acquired many softpowers such as —

- 1) Yoga — healthy exercise
- 2) Ayurveda — healthy without side effects
- 3) Medical tourism
- 4) Intellectual ability
- 5) IT and BPO
- 6) Heritage and handcrafts
- 7) Most importantly Social Capital

India has used these soft powers in various diplomatic initiatives in the past. Yoga was propagated at the U.N.G.A. Ayurveda is a

matter of research for medicinal benefits. Heritage and traditional ties, common culture with many nations and diplomatic ability of India.

Limitations of soft power diplomacy:

- 1) Limited economic capacity to propagate soft powers
- 2) Limited acceptance amongst various countries
- 3) Developed countries can exploit India's soft power for their benefit like patenting Yoga, Bio-piracy.

14. Highlight the features of NAVIC and bring out its significance for India. How is it different from GAGAN? Examine whether NAVIC can be a replacement of GPS for India.

NAVIC is an initiative of Department of S&T. It is an indigenous Navigation and positioning system.

ISRO has recently launched GSAT-6 the seventh satellite into the space as a part of NAVIC.

Features :

- 1) It involves 9 satellites — 4 in geo synchronous orbit, 3 in geo stationary and 2 on standby.
- 2) Better positioning than GPS — 10m accuracy.
- 3) Two services — ① Global Positioning System for all.
② Restricted Positioning System for Defense purposes.

4) Region covered — 1500 km from Indian borders.

Significance for India:

- 1) Indigenous and hence suitable US during Kargil war denied India GPS facility
- 2) Accurate
- 3) Can be used for —
 - Innovation
 - Agricultural activities
 - Business activities
 - Research and survey
- 4) It will cover areas ranging from 1500 km boundary of India thus cover other, South Asian countries Australia, Indian Ocean Region, Central Asia and West Asian countries.
- 5) Thus, it will ~~aid~~ aid regional integration of IOR and increase India's dominance in the region.

Due to high accuracy of 10m and reliability, NAVIC can act as replacement of GPS in India.

15. What are Carbon Nanotubes (CNTs) and how are they an improvement over carbon fibres? Highlight the various unique properties of CNTs which makes them suitable to the manufacturing industry.

Carbon nano tubes are cylindrical - hollow - pipe like nano structures made of Carbon atoms.

CNTs are light due to hollowness, strong due to lattice structural arrangement of atoms in hexagonal pattern. Thus, they are more lighter and stronger than carbon fibres. Hence an improvement over the Carbon fibres.

Unique features of CNT are -

- 1) Light weight
- 2) Strength is higher than steel.
- 3) Flexible
- 4) Inert to major chemicals and corrosive environments.
- 5) Mouldable into any shape and size.

These features can be used by the manufacturing industry for various products such as —

- 1) Air planes, Cars, bikes-frame to reduce weight
- 2) Badminton rackets etc due to strength and light weight.

Because of mouldability, merr, light and strong they can be used by almost every manufacturing industry

16. Explain the significance of gravitational waves recently detected by LIGO. What are the objectives of the recently envisaged LIGO-India project and what benefits will India accrue from it?

WHO declares an epidemic as a pandemic under Public Health Emergency of International Concern (PHEIC) on the basis of following criteria —

- ① Substantial loss to human lives
- ② Multi-country or multi-regional aspect of contamination and spread.

Recently, WHO declared Ebola and Zika as a pandemic. But, it has raised various concerns —

↳ Delay in declaration and acceptance of epidemic and the state of emergency by WHO. By the time WHO declared Ebola as pandemic, already 30,000 lives were lost.

2. WHO is mainly dominated by developed countries and thus is not purely representative.
3. Governance of WHO is not democratic and often biased in the favour of developed countries.
4. Rich pharmaceuticals enjoy good level of influence in various aspects of WHO governance.

India preparedness to handle such epidemics :

1. Lack of monitoring and data collection in health sector makes it vulnerable to negligence.
2. Lack of adequate nutrition and sanitation further amplifies chances of easy contamination and spread of disease.
3. Inadequate and ill-equipped health centres and professionals.
4. Over dependence of on Private sector.

5. Poverty—major roadblock in access to good health care

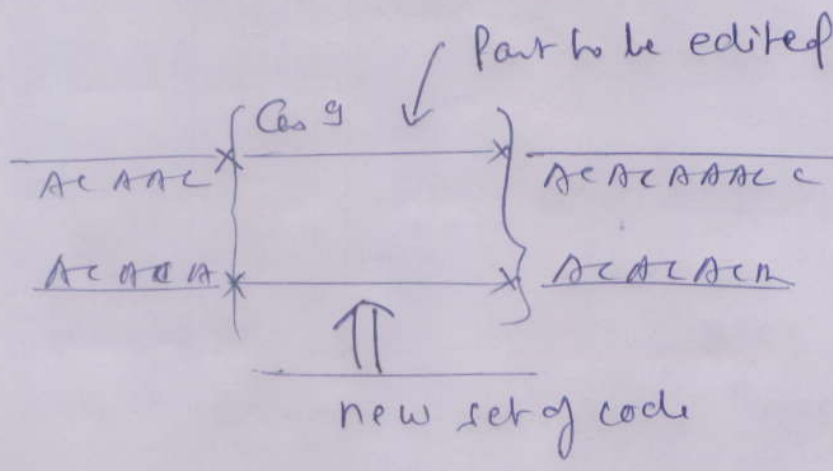
Recent efforts by government such as Swachh Bharat Abhiyan are potentially good efforts to reduce India's susceptibility to epidemics.

18. Give a brief explanation of CRISPR - gene editing technology. Also discuss its significance in modern biology and agriculture.

Process involved

1. Enzyme naturally obtained is inserted into the DNA.
2. After reaching the predestined location and site, Cas9 scissors out the genes to be replaced.
3. New gene is inserted at the site.



Significance in modern biology —

- 1) It can be used to edit the stem cells genes and treat cancer, parkinson and other genetic disorders.
- 2) It can be used in agriculture technology to modify and make GM crops.
- 3) It can be used to make bio-remedy and bio-fertilizers.
- 4) It can be used to treat many probable genetic deficiencies that may arise in future.
- 5) It opens a new pandora box for research in bio-technology.

- 3> Requirement of new tracks also demand vast land which is difficult due to its cost and probable litigation and hindrances

- 4) Usually they run short distances at high speed. India has a rare geography.
- 5) The curves of already existent railway lines are not designed for fast curves.
- 6) Uneven topography also creates challenge for even high speed trains.
