
Here is a boy who painted a compound wall in a different way. How did he do it?

"No, no! he said," Aunt Polly is very particular about this fence. Everybody cannot paint the wall right way."


"Is that so?" asked Ben in surprise. "Tom, I'II be very careful. Please, let me try just a little."
