Exclamatory Sentence से आश्चर्य (Surprise), सुख (Happiness), दुःख (Sorrow), आनन्द (Pleasure), क्रोध (Anger), नफरत (Hate), प्रशंसा (Admiration), तीव्र इच्छा (Strong desire) इत्यादि की अभिव्यक्ति (Expression) होती है। उदाहरण के लिए मान लें कि कोई बहुत तेज दौड़ता है और हमारे मुँह से अचानक निकल जाता है—िकतना तेज वह दौड़ता है! How fast he runs! इसी बात को सीधे-सीधे सरल एवं स्पष्ट रूप से कह सकते हैं—'वह बहुत तेज दौड़ता है'—"He runs very fast' और यह एक Assertive Sentence है। इस प्रकार Exclamatory Sentences के अन्दर निहित अर्थ / भाव को समझकर उन्हें Assertive Sentences में Transform किया जाता है। Transformation की इस प्रक्रिया से संबंधित नीचे दिए गए Rules पर गौर करें—

Exclamatory Sentence यदि What/How या Such से शुरू हो, तो उसे Assertive में transform करते समय यह देखना चाहिए कि What/How या Such के बाद Adjective है या Noun. यदि Noun है तो How/What या Such की जगह पर 'great, fine, lovely. wonderful, strange, peculiar, terrible इत्यादि में से किसी एक Adjective का प्रयोग कर Sentence में Subject + Verb + Object + Complement के word-order को follow करते हैं। यदि What/How या Such के बाद Adjective/Adverb है तो What/How या Such की जगह पर 'very' का प्रयोग कर Sentence में ऊपर दिए गए word-order को follow करते हैं; जैसे—

Exclamatory	Assertive	
What a fine picture it is!	It is a very fine picture.	
What a lovely garden it is!	It is a very lovely garden.	
How beautiful she looks!	She looks very beautiful.	
How fast he runs!	He runs very fast.	
What a scene it is!	It is a wonderful/strange/lovely scene	
What a coward you are!	You are a great coward.	
What a piece of work is man	! Man is a strange piece of work.	

कभी-कभी Exclamatory Sentence में Subject तथा Verb लुप्त रहते हैं। ऐसी स्थिति
में transform करते समय अपनी तरफ से आवश्यकतानुसार Suitable Subject तथा
Verb का प्रयोग किया जाता है; जैसे—

Exclamatory	Assertive	
How nice!	It is very nice.	
How terrible (भयानक)!	It is very terrible.	
What a fall (पतन)!	It is/was a great/big/terrible fall.	
Such a place!	It is a lovely place.	

3. यदि Exclamatory Sentence Would that/O that/Oh that/Oh for/If I could only/If I were इत्यादि में से किसी एक से शुरू हो, तो Assertive में Transform करते समय Sentence normally I wish या I earnestly desire से शुरू किया जाता है। ऐसे Sentences से यह मालूम होता है कि कोई हार्दिक इच्छा व्यक्त की जा रही है: जैसे—

If I were a millionaire! (यदि मैं लखपति होता!)	I wish that I were a millionaire.
O that he were my faithful friend!	I wish that he were my faithful friend.

If only I could gain the first prize!	I earnestly desire to gain the first prize.
Oh for a grand building to live in!	I wish I had a grand building to live in.
O for a cup of tea!	I wish for a cup of tea. or,
	I wish that I could get a cup of tea.
If that I could get a job!	I earnestly wish (strongly desire) that I could get a job.

 कुछ Exclamatory Sentences Infinitive (to + V¹) से शुरू होते हैं । इन्हें It is strange/ surprising/sad + that clause के form में Transform किया जाता है । जैसे—

Exclamatory	Assertive
To think of your coming here so soon!	It is strange (surprising) that you should come here so soon.
To think of his untimely death!	It is sad to think of his untimely death.
To think of your forgetting your father's name!	It is surprising that you should forget your father's name.

From Assertive to Exclamatory

Assertive Sentences की Exclamatory Sentences में transform करने के लिए उस प्रक्रिया के ठीक उल्टी प्रक्रिया अपनाते हैं जो प्रक्रिया Exclamatory Sentences को Assertive में transform करने के लिए अपनाई जाती है। नीचे दिए गए Examples को समझकर अपना concept clear करें—

It was a great victory.	What a victory it was!
She is a peculiar woman.	What a woman she is!
He has very noble ideas.	What noble ideas he has!
I wish that I were rich.	O that I were rich!

It is sad that he should die young.	Alas that he should die young!
It is indeed a great disaster.	Good heavens! What a disaster!
