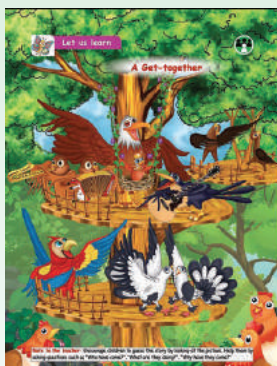


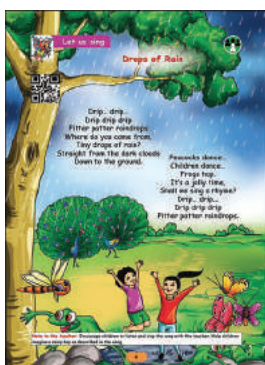
Unit 1 - My Garden



- ◆ Children love flowers and birds.
- ◆ The **comic strip (The Cactus)** helps children explore and talk about various flowers they see and know about their unique features.
- ◆ The **poem (Little Birdie)** helps children talk about birds.
- ◆ The **rebus story (A Get-together)** helps children read the story with words and pictures.
- ◆ The teacher needs to encourage children to treat birds and animals with kindness.

Unit 2 - Time and Calendar

- ◆ Children are curious about the concept of time. It is important for them to know the days and months of a year.
- ◆ The **journal (Harini's Happy Week)** helps children to associate interesting events with days of the week.
- ◆ The **poem (Months in a Year)** helps children know the name of the months in a year.
- ◆ The **rebus story (A Day at Home)** helps children read the story with the words and pictures familiar to them.
- ◆ The teacher needs to encourage children to follow a daily routine.



Unit - 3 Rain... Rain... Rain...

- ◆ Children love to play in the rain.
- ◆ Various water bodies are described through the **comic strip (From the sky to the sea)**.
- ◆ The **poem (Drops of Rain)** helps children imagine a rainy day.
- ◆ The **rebus story (A Rainy Day)** helps children read the story with the words and pictures familiar to them.
- ◆ The teacher needs to encourage children to follow various ways to save water.

- ◆ It is also a **diagnostic page** for the teachers to ensure that each student has attained the expected learning outcomes in each unit.



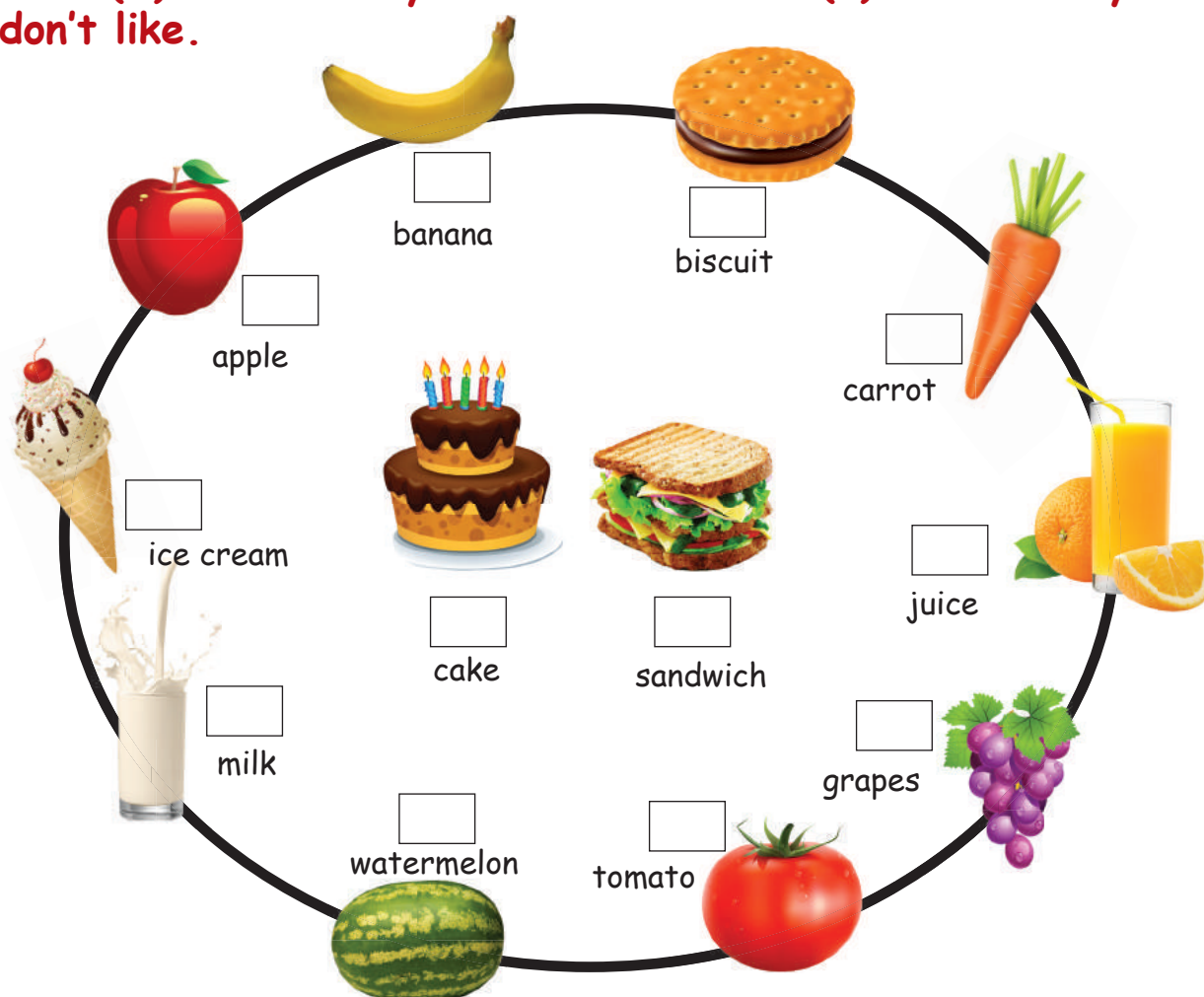
How to use QR Code in the textbooks

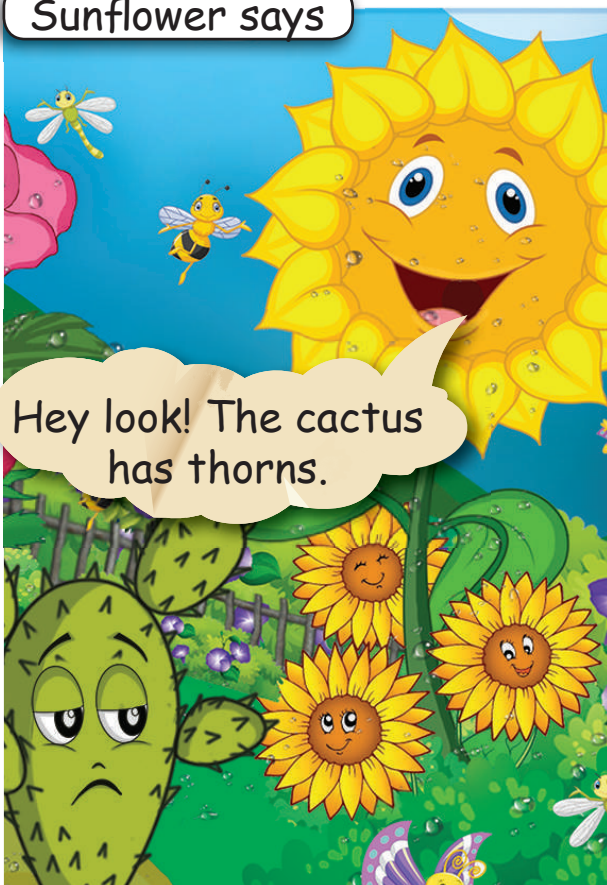
The Cactus
