Read the passages given below.

All along a 450-mile stretch of west coast America is the home of the tallest trees in the world. Once, in this narrow hinterland of the Pacific coast, from central California to southern Oregon, were two million acres of these trees, the Coast Redwood. Today there are just a few hundred acres of them in Redwood Belt's scattering of State Parks, protected forest reserves amidst which are stands of the giants.

About 25 miles due south of San Jose and the heart of Silicon Valley is one of the smaller of these stands, just 40 acres in the midst of the 4650-acre Henry Cowell Redwoods State Park. And there I found myself one morning not so long ago peering up to spot the tops of trees that seemed to be touching the skies. All I got was a crick in the neck. A tip for other Escapists': Stick to looking at the thick and rough-barked trunks.

But even looking at a trunk when you try to grab a view of The Giant's trunk from close can be quite a challenge. The Giant, the star of the Park, has a trunk with a circumference of over 50 feet and a diameter of 17 feet. Maybe you can, but I couldn't take it all in. Nor could I come anywhere near taking in the whole 275 feet of the Giant's height. Once the tallest Redwood, it lost its title when a storm several years ago knocked down 75 feet of its top to bring it to its present height. But it'll need the mother of all storms for its record of being the oldest tree in the park - an estimated 2000-plus years old - to be knocked down. You wonder at such a giant growing from a tiny seed; 100,000 seeds to a pound will give you an idea of how tiny! You wonder too about the marvel of a root system that sinks only six to twelve feet holding up such **giants** till the Range you are talking to explain that the roots spread laterally and intertwine with the roots of other Redwoods to create a carpet.





9. The pie charts illustrate the ages of people employed in the UK public sector for two years, 2015 and 2020. Overall, while the percentage of those employed in their 20s and 40s increased, employment for other ages groups, particularly the over 50s, fell. Turning first to the younger age groups, although the employment of workers under 21

actually fell from 14% in 2015 to 12% in 2020, the overall number of workers under 30 actually rose because of the surge in the employment of 21-30-year-olds, which increased significantly from 23% to 33%. Similarly, the number of employees over the age of 40 climbed from 19% in 2015 to 28% by 2020.

However, other groups saw quite significant falls in employment. For 31-40-year-olds, the employment figure plummeted from 21% in 2015 to just 11% by 2020, which represented a substantial drop of more than 50% in relative terms. Likewise, the employment of over 50s declined, though not by quite so much, standing at 23% in 2015 and 16% in 2020.

OR

The pie chart illustrates the proportion of women in poverty by household composition in the United States in 2008 and the bar graph indicates the differences in rates of poverty by sex and age. At first glance, it can be seen that single women with no dependent children made up the largest group in poverty and that poverty was highest for women and children.

The pie chart shows that single women suffered from poverty the most. Single women without children represented 54% of the total in poverty, and poverty for those with dependent children stood at just over a quarter. Married women with and without children accounted for the remaining fifth or 20%.

Turning to the bar chart, poverty rates were highest amongst children, and the rates were roughly equal for males and females, at around 21% for under 5s and 15% for 5-17-year-olds. However, from ages 18-24, the gap between men and women widened significantly, with approximately 14% of men in poverty compared to over 20% for women. Poverty declined throughout the adult years for both sexes, but a gap remained and this gap almost doubled in old age.

- would agree to the proposal. He feels extremely happy and thinks that both of them will make a good match. He embraces and kisses Lomov calling him his darling and angel and such names. He reveals that he has been hoping to marry his daughter with Lomov and has no been fulfilled.
- iii. She wrote a note to request her to stop making fun of Wanda. She thought it was cruel. She could not dare to say all that verbally so she wrote a note to Peggy. But then she pictured herself as a new target for Peggy and other girls, making fun of her for wearing hand-me-down clothes. She shuddered and tore the note.

B. (any two)

- i. Mrs. Pumphrey behaved in a very silly and thoughtless manner by over pampering and overfeeding Tricky. It was totally a waste of money. And indirectly, she was responsible for his ill health. As a result of her over-pampering, she overfed Tricki and gave him no exercise at all. This made Tricki fall seriously ill.
- ii. Mrs. Hall was ready to avoid the scientist's strange habits and abnormal behaviour because he had paid her in advance. She thought that her guest was an eccentric scientist but she was satisfied as she had received money from him. So she decided to excuse his strange habits and irritable temper.
- iii. The Tehsildar Sahib advised Ram Lal that, being a representative of the government, he must send his daughters to school. Ram Lal did not have the courage to disobey him. He also felt that there was a little chance of Bholi's getting married due to her ugly face and lack of sense.

- The tiger expresses his anger quietly because he is helpless. He is in quiet rage as
 he is locked and his freedom has been curtailed. Thus, he is unable to show his
 anger and ferocity. He can do nothing from behind the bars. He is not as free as he
 was in the forest.
- ii. According to Lomov, Squeezer was inferior to Guess, his own dog. Lomov considered it an overshot as Squeezer's lower jaw was shorter than his upper jaw.
