E-card businesses are considered environment-friendly because their carbon footprint is generally much lower as compared to paper card companies and because the paper is not used in the end product.

For example, unlike traditional greeting cards, e-cards can be easily sent to many people at once or extensively personalized by the sender. Conceivably they could be saved to any computer or electronic device or even viewed on a television set, and digital video e-cards have begun emerging.

Typically an e-card sender chooses from an online catalogue of e-card made available on a publisher's website. After selecting a card, the sender can personalize it to various degrees by adding a message, photo or video. Finally, the sender specifies the recipients' e-mail address and the website delivers an e-mail message to the recipient on behalf of the sender.

This concept of e-cards is innovative and delivers an intrinsic pleasure to both the sender and the receiver.
