Bacteria reproduce by dividing themselves into two, and these new individuals grow so quickly that they are ready to divide again in about half an hour. In ten hours a single bacterium can produce over a million bacteria. So, no object is completely free from bacteria. Few bacteria can survive a temperature above 80°C in moisture. Multiplication of bacteria is slowed down below 10°C. It means that food will remain unaffected by bacteria in a refrigerator. Drying is also another method of preserving food. Dehydration of foodstuff prevents bacteria from growing and multiplying as there is insufficient moisture.
