4. How did Gopal get inside the palace to see the king after he had bought the fish?

Sol. Gopal reached the palace with a huge hilsa-fish in his hand. But the guard didn't allow him to meet the king. At this Gopal began to dance and sing loudly. When the king came to know, he ordered the guard to bring Gopal to him immediately.

5. Explain why no one seemed to be inviterested in talking about the hilsa-fish which Gopal had bought?

- **Sol.** Everyone got so much interested in Gopal's abnormal appearance that he/she didn't pay any attention on the fish which he had caught in his hand.
