- 1. d The passage is about mountaineering. So, 'climbers' is the most appropriate word to be used.
- 2. d The passage, in the later lines, talks about dining at the mountain heights.
- 3. c The sentence is about disbelief shown by the gesture of raising an eyebrow.
- 4. a The 'economic crisis' led to the revolt/riots.
- 5. a It is a 'formal' three-course dinner with all courtesies observed.
- 6. d 'gatecrash', which means to arrive uninvited or to interrupt is the correct answer.
- 7. a The focus is on breaking the record and not on the revolution.
- 8. d The table set would go along with the climbers for the dinner. Hence, accompanying is with the climbers the correct option.
- 9. d The mountaineers are wrapped and covered in layers of wooly clothing. Thus, we use the word 'swathes'.
- 10. b There is only one female, hence use 'solitary'.
- 11. d A 'universal' hit is a hit anywhere in the world.
- d 'Incidentally' means as a matter of coincidence.
 Rest of the options are either misspelt or logically incorrect.
- 13. d 'approaches' and 'challenges' have the right parallel structure.
- 14. d 'complex' means that it was tough to handle.
- 15. d 'justifies', which means to prove right or just is the correct answer.
- 16. c 'midst' is the right use, meaning in the middle of.
- c Use 'seem' (singular verb) with 'hollywood' (singular subject).
- 18. b The word 'giving' should be used here and not 'give'
- 19. d 'dramatically' is the right adverb to be used here.

- 20. c Use singular verb 'reflects' for the singular noun 'system'.
- 21. c 'detrimental' brings out the reason why the companies have been forced to break up.
- 22. d 'strong' goes with 'positive'.
- 23. d 'sleep-walk' indicates that Michael Douglas can put in a performance without trying too hard and still be the best.
- 24. d 'demarcate' means to draw a line that separates movies and real life.
- 25. d They cannot sleep because they are afraid. Hence, 'fearing' is used.
- 26. a A is the opening sentence which states that the delegates took off. This is followed by the pair 'BC', which states when and where they went. Hence, the correct sequence is 'ABCDE'.
- 27. c 'AB' is a mandatory pair as the pronouns 'their' and 'them' used in these sentences refer to the same persons. B states that they could get rid of something and D states what exactly they could get rid of (apartheid). Hence, 'ABD' is a mandatory sequence. Note that this sequence can be found only in option (c). Hence, this is the correct option.
- 28. b B definitely follows A in order to complete a logically correct phrase i.e. in some sense. The correct sentence is 'In some sense the old order continues'.
- 29. d C follows A in order to complete the verb form i.e. *is rising.* The correct sequence is 'BACED'.
- 30. d 'EA' is the opening mandatory pair as it gives us the subject of the sentence i.e. 'a walk in the evening'. This leaves us with only one possible option, which is option (d).
