Water used for washing vegetables can be used for watering the plants.

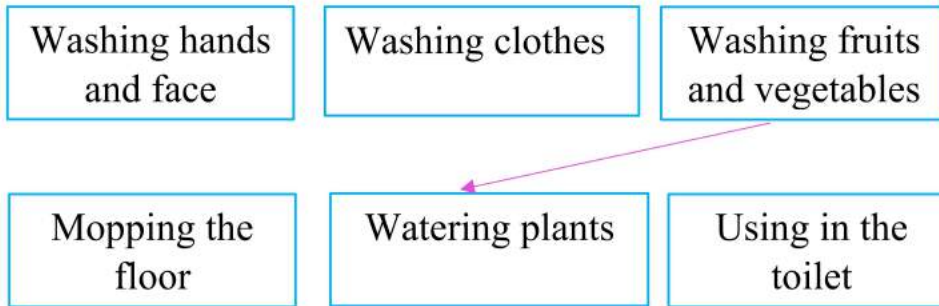
Question 2: Have you seen water flowing unnecessarily in your home, school or any other place? Where?
