HINTS & EXPLANATIONS

LEVEL - I

- 1. (d) When a seed germinates, it puts forth shoots. In other words, it sprouts.
- 2. (a) John D Rockefeller was an oil magnate. Onassis was a shipping tycoon. Both Rockefeller and Onassis were big businessmen, their spheres being oil (petroleum) and shipping respectively. Both magnate and tycoon refer to businessmen who have made it big, their success making them rich and powerful.
- **3.** (d) A facet of something is a single part or aspect of it.
- **4.** (c) If you persuade me to do something, you try to convince me that it should be done.
- **5.** (c) Certain categories of companies have been exempted from paying tax. That is, they do not have to shoulder the burden of tax- paying. In other words, their burden has been relieved.
- **6.** (c) Not available
- **7.** (c) Cordon means a line of people, policemen or soldiers which guards or prevents people entering or leaving an area.
- **8.** (b) Rectify is to correct.
- **9.** (b) When a law is revoked, it stands cancelled. We can also say that the law has been repealed.
- 10. (d) I have lost my reputation and nothing can redeem it. That is, much though I may try, no good action on my part can bring my lost reputation back. In other words, I cannot recover my reputation.
- **11.** (c) Adult means a person who is frilly grown or developed that is mature.
- **12.** (c) Diligent as an adjective means having or showing care and conscientiousness in one's work or duties. So the word 'Hardworking' is the correct synonym.
- **13.** (c) Fragile is the object which is easily broken or damaged and therefore, delicate is the correct option.

- **14.** (c) Goods is inherently useful and relatively scarce tangible item; article, commodity, material, merchandise, supply, produced from ↔ agricultural ↔ construction, manufacturing, or mining activities. Material is the right option.
- **15.** (d) Synopsis means brief summary or general survey of something. So summary is the right option.
- **16.** (a) Ancestor refers to a person, typically one more remote than a grandparent, from whom one is descended. Descendant means the opposite that is a person, plant, or animal that is descended from a particular ancestor.
- 17. (d) Authentic means something of undisputed origin and not a copy or genuine. The word unreal is the correct antonym as it means something imaginary or illusory.
- **18.** (a) Furious means extremely angry therefore calm is the right antonym.
- **19.** (d) Genuine means something authentic and fake means not genuine; imitation or counterfeit.
- **20.** (d) Rigid means unable to bend or be forced out of shape; not flexible. Tolerant broadly means showing willingness to allow the existence of opinions or behaviour that one does not necessarily agree with.
- **21.** (a) Roost
- **22.** (a) Hinder means to prevent the growth or progress of something while expedite is to make fast the process or facilitate. Vindicate means to justify.
- **23.** (b) Trait means characteristic.
- **24.** (c) Origin means the starting point and remnant is what is left after finishing or distribution.
- **25.** (b) Prove means to state that a statement or theory is correct after giving valid and logical reasons while assumption is something which is believed without any proofs or evidence.
- **26.** (b) Frail means something or someone very weak, usually due to illness.

- **27.** (a) Proclaim is to announce usually in favour of, denounce means to speak against.
- **28.** (a) Radical comes from Latin radix (= root). If you make a radical change in something, the change goes to its very roots, thus affecting the entire thing. On the other hand, there are changes which do not disturb the entire thing; the changes take place only on the surface. In other words, they are superficial changes.
- **29.** (b) Holistic medicine treats the whole person, not just the diseased part. That which is holistic is based on the principles of holism. Holism is the belief that everything in nature is connected in some way. A piecemeal approach, on the other hand, deals with only one part at a time.
- **30.** (b) Having piled a huge total, the Sri Lankan cricket team was in a dominating position. That is, the Sri Lankans were in control of the match (the Independence Cup final). The Pakistani a succumbed to the pressure. That is, they were affected the Sri Lankan domination.
- **31.** (a) The preposition to expressing motion in the direction of a particular location.
- **32.** (b) Pair here means a set of two things used together or regarded as a unit.
- **33.** (a) Sent in past participle form means go or be taken to a particular destination
- **34.** (a) The adjective here means feeling weary and impatient because one is unoccupied or lacks interest in one's current activity.
- **35.** (a) In the verb form sell means to give or hand over something in exchange for money.
- **36.** (b) Here the sense means of a specified period of time occurring before and leading up to the time of speaking or writing.
- **37.** (a) Here knows means to have knowledge or information concerning somebody or something.
