## **Phrases**

Idioms are words, phrases, or expressions that are either grammatically unusual. Example: "Long time, no seel", or their meaning cannot be taken literally. Example: "It's raining cats and dogs!" This expression does not mean that cats and dogs are falling from the sky, but it is a metaphorical expression (word picture) that means that it is raining very heavily.

## What are idioms?

An Idiom (also called idiomatic expression) is an expression, word, or phrase that don't mean exactly what the words say. They have, however, hidden meanings. Idioms are phrases that mean something different than what the words say.

## **Example:**

- Time flies quickly when I'm swimming in the pool.
- Of course, clocks don't have wings and time can't fly through the air.
- Time flies is an idiom that means time goes by quickly.
