## **Subject-Verb Agreement Rules**

A verb describes an action or a state of being. This action is performed by a subject (A Noun or a Pronoun) or the state of being is that of a subject. Hence, **a verb must always agree with its subject**, in person (First, Second and Third) and in number (Singular and Plural).

The following tables show the subject-verb agreement according to person and number:
